Project Description/Justification:

The Department of Corrections has approximately \$14.3 million in state-owned equipment and more than \$4.7 million in replacement needs. Replacement of old and worn-out equipment has been deferred for many years and further deferral of this equipment will severely reduce safety, security, decrease food service capability, and other day-to-day operations capability. This project will allow for the replacement of antiquated systems and equipment at institutions throughout the state. It also includes some new purchases of necessary maintenance, grounds keeping, snow removal, and kitchen equipment. All institutions operate 24 hours a day, seven days a week. This equipment is used constantly and continually supporting life, health, and safety needs of correctional officers, probation officers and other staff, and 3,700 inmates at the institutions. Their sustained use requires funding for routine replacement of old and worn out equipment every fiscal year. This project allows the institutional facilities and probation offices to purchase critical institutional, probation and program support equipment.
