### **Project Description/Justification:**

The Division of Vocational Rehabilitation administers the Business Enterprise Program (BEP) under the authority of AS 23.15.100. The BEP provides employment opportunities for blind and significantly disabled individuals through the establishment and operation of vending facilities on state and federal properties. Through AS 23.15.135 (b), the division coordinates vendor facility operations with the Committee of Blind Vendors.

In addition, these upgrades will generate increased foot traffic immediately and increased profits in the long term, which will invigorate the program and strengthen blind & disabled vendors' ability to be self-employed and self-supporting.

Capital expenditures and ongoing operating costs for the program will come from the Business Enterprise Program Revolving Fund (AS 23.15.130), which is funded by receipts and chargebacks from businesses and vending managed through the program.

In sum, these funds will dramatically improve the program facilities and enable program participants to provide the best value to Alaskans while lowering the cost of program delivery.
