Additional authority is requested to receive and expend \$387.8 in federal funds granted from the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, Bureau of Justice Assistance. Alaska's district attorney offices cover vast geographical areas and deal with a large number of cases. Specialized teams of prosecutors and paralegals with the responsibility of handling these cases will remove the competition for resources that presently exists and will eventually result in communities that are safer for these victims. This project will provide for specialized units in Alaska's busiest district attorney offices to focus solely on sexual assault/domestic violence cases - both those where the victim is an adult as well as the many in which a child is victimized. These cases will then receive the prosecutorial expertise and resource commitment that is necessary to insure consistent vigorous prosecution and appropriate attention to victim's rights and needs. Specialization and the ablility to focus that specialization is necessary to more effectively prosecute these kinds of cases.

Law is requesting a total of \$482,800 in general funds to replace funding reductions for drug prosecution. Ultimately, Law is expecting a reduction of as much as \$700,000 in funds passed from the Department of Public Safety to the Criminal Division for drug prosecution. Congress has been reducing its support for drug enforcement prosecution since 2005. Because federal funds carry forward between state fiscal years, the full effect of ratcheting down the funding will not be felt until state FY 2008. These grant funds paid for three attorneys, a paralegal and a law office assistant in Anchorage, one attorney in Palmer and one in Fairbanks, plus overhead costs associated with those offices in all three locations. The version of the budget bill that passed Congress severely reduces funds for this program but the full effect of the reduction for FY 2006 and FY 2007 will not be known until as late as March of 2006. Law is particularly concerned about the shortfall coming at the same time when the use and manufacture of methamphetamine is on the rise in Alaska. Meth presents a very real threat to Alaska as it has an addiction rate similar to that of crack cocaine (8 out of 10 persons trying meth once will become addicts) and can be cheaply made from household ingredients. Due to the economic recession and plummeting stock markets, the Trust has decreased its financial projections for FY2010 since original budget approval in September 2008. This project is being reduced as part of an overall budget reduction which decreases MHTAAR requests to equal projected MHTAAR availability.

MH Trust: Dis Justice - Deliver training for prosecutors statewide to understand and effectively handle legal cases involving persons with mental health disorders and/or cognitive impairments.

This project maintains a critical component of the Disability Justice Focus Area by providing foundational knowledge on mental health disorders and cognitive impairments, best-practice and available treatment, and our state's community behavioral health system. These legal professionals typically have received little or no training in these areas, yet a significant percentage of individuals they interact with professionally experience mental health disorders and/or cognitive impairments. By providing this training and education these legal professionals are better equipped to understand the needs of Trust beneficiaries, to consider underlying causes for a beneficiary's contact with the criminal justice system, and to set appropriate conditions of bail/probation given the individual's mental and/or cognitive capacity, thus minimizing the risk of future costs associated with incarceration and the processing of another criminal case as a result of bail/probation violations.

The Cold Case Prosecution Unit has prosecuted ten cases since its creation in 2006. All but one of these cases (a gang related homicide), involved sexual assault or domestic violence. Eight cases went to trial; two resulted in pleas. Cold cases require intensive prosecutorial attention at the investigation stage because evidence is almost always circumstantial and stale, which means that attorneys must work more closely with investigators to devise strategies for legally obtaining corroborative evidence. For this reason cold cases generally take longer than similar non-cold cases, averaging five and a half months from screening to conviction. There are currently 100 cold cases under investigation by four Department of Public Safety investigators. In addition to these 100 cases, the number of cold cases the Municipality of Anchorage refers to the Cold Case Prosecution Unit is expected to increase because the Municipality has received a \$500,000 grant and has requested an additional \$500,000 to investigate cold cases in its jurisdiction.

This paralegal will assist the two child protective services attorneys located in Bethel. These attorneys have no paralegal, although their 90 case per attorney workload is numerically equivalent to child protection attorneys in offices with full paralegal support. One of the challenges that can make cases in Bethel more labor intensive than in other offices is that almost all actions in Bethel proceed under the Indian Child Welfare Act (ICWA) which requires more proof than would otherwise be necessary, including testimony by an expert in Alaska Native culture about the factual issues of the case. If the requirements of ICWA are not met, the child, parents, or tribe may ask the court to vacate its orders and begin new proceedings.

Because they have no paralegal, the attorneys in the Bethel office must gather all relevant documents from multiple sources, review and redact all discovery, write termination and guardianship petitions, prepare all motions, locate and prepare fact and expert witnesses, prepare subpoenas, prepare exhibit lists, compile and label exhibits -- functions that would normally be fully or partially delegated to a skilled but lower-paid paralegal. Bethel attorneys perform these functions in addition to the regular court hearings and meetings required on an ongoing basis in Child in Need of Aid (CINA) cases.

Although the section attempts to support the Bethel office with paralegals from other geographic areas of the state, long-distance services are not wholly effective and siphon resources needed in the other geographic areas. The amount of preparation time required of the attorneys can result in cases not proceeding as quickly as they should. At times, important trials that should allow children in the system to find permanent homes have had to be delayed to allow sufficient time for preparation.

Statutory Designated Program Receipts (SDPR) for the Consumer Protection unit is on the downswing due to the absence of large-dollar consumer protection / antitrust cases on the horizon. In recent years, this area of the budget has increasingly relied on SDPR as general funds have been reduced. Sufficient receipts exist through FY05, but our projections indicate that FY06 will be short funded. Total authorization from this fund source is \$636,900.

\$680,381 is currently available, down from \$1,000,000 available at the beginning of FY04. We anticipate additional collections this year of \$230,000 - \$300,000. The Department currently has four measures focused on consumer protection and aimed specifically at increasing consumer education, strengthening consumer protection legislation and regulations, effectively enforcing consumer laws and regulations, and reducing unfair methods of

The Department of Law requests additional funding in the Natural Resources Section to pursue the Governor's statehood defense and natural resource development initiatives. These funds will be used to advocate for the state's right to access public lands and the right to develop state and private natural resources.

The success of the Governor's statehood defense and resource development initiatives requires a knowledgeable legal team. The positions will work with the Governor's Office and the state's resource agencies to challenge federal initiatives that unreasonably limit or delay responsible resource development, and will continue the state's aggressive advocacy of its rights through litigation.

An example of federal actions requiring state intervention are the currently ongoing revisions of federal land management plans. Active state involvement is important because these plan revisions will guide activities in and access through national parks, wildlife refuges (including ANWR), forests, NPR-A and BLM land in Alaska. Other examples include BLM proposals to vacate existing easements through ANCSA conveyances to public lands. And to preserve access on RS 2477 rights-of-way, the state will initiate quiet title actions against the federal government (for the purpose of planning requirements, Utah, another state aggressively seeking title to its RS 2477 rights-of-way, has tasked seven attorneys to gather evidence and prepare its RS 2477 cases for filing). For instance, section attorneys are engaged in multiple lawsuits and administrative proceedings involving federal Endangered Species Act decisions. As an example of a position the state takes in these actions, the state opposes listing healthy populations of animals based on speculative models of climate 100 years in the future; the state urges the use of shorter, more accurate time frames. In the timber arena, section attorneys are pursuing an appeal in the 9th Circuit to reinstate an Alaska-specific exemption to the federal Roadless Rule. Simultaneously, the section is seeking to overturn the Roadless Rule through a declaratory judgment action in Washington, D.C. With regard to mineral development, the section is providing critical advice to assure that the permits the state issues are well supported. The section is also defending against administrative appeals and lawsuits opposing mineral development, particularly in southwest Alaska. Other work already engaging section attorneys includes navigability, submerged land and public water issues (such as the Peratorvich case concerning whether pockets of federal fisheries management exist within larger state management areas), and all fish and game management issues.

The Department of Law, Oil, Gas & Mining Section attorneys and specialized contract counsel advise the Alaska Gasline Inducement Act (AGIA) Gas Pipeline Project Office, Governor's Office and the Commissioners of Department of Natural Resources (DNR) and Department of Revenue (DOR) to implement the AGIA license and advance the state's efforts to promote a large-scale gasline to transport gas from the North Slope for in-state use and for export. Section attorneys and contract counsel advise and assist the commissioners in conducting due diligence on the AGIA license implementation, including costs, license reimbursements, compliance, proposed commercial and financial arrangements, matters related to fiscal certainty, and confidentiality issues. Section attorneys work closely with specialized outside legal counsel to advise the commissioners on federal jurisdictional, statutory and regulatory issues that affect the gasline project, including matters relating to the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC). Law is also assisting and advising the agencies regarding TransCanada's and the North Slope gas producers' South Central Liquefied Natural Gas (LNG) alignment to evaluate the viability of a large-diameter LNG pipeline to tidewater in Alaska that would allow for natural gas exports to the Pacific Rim and gas for in-state use. Law works with and advises DNR and DOR concerning the AGIA licensee's participation in the LNG project. The Oil, Gas and Mining section attorneys also assist DOR and DNR with issues relating audits of reimbursement funds and other project matters.

The Alaska Marine Highway System (AMHS) must file a lawsuit against the contractor responsible for the design and construction of the fast ferries Fairweather and Chenega. The suit will also name the companies responsible for the vessels' propulsion systems. AMHS must file suit now before the expiration of the statute of limitations.

Since AMHS accepted delivery of the vessels in 2004 and 2005, the propulsion systems have been subject to recurrent problems. Typical of the problems encountered with the vessels was the massive overhaul required on the Fairweather beginning in February 2006 at Ketchikan Ship and Drydock. All four diesel engines had hairline cracks in their steel sleeves, and there were additional problems with bull gears, shafts and bearings. If not addressed, the propulsion system problems will require continued maintenance, which will disrupt service, and will shorten the expected lifespan of the engines.

The lawsuit is against Robert E. Derecktor, Inc., the contractor responsible for the design and construction of the ferries, and against MTU Friedrichshafen, GmbH and MTU Detroit Diesel, Inc., the entities responsible for the vessels' propulsion systems.

The Department of Law (DOL) requests an appropriation for FY 2009 in the amount of \$4.7 million to pursue claims for penalties and lost revenues for the 2006 Prudhoe Bay pipeline spills and production shutdowns. DOL's current investigation, funded through the Response Fund, is ongoing but expected to be complete next fall. A limited tolling agreement with BP Exploration (Alaska), Inc. (BPXA) with regard to potential claims subject to a two year statute of limitations will expire as early as September 2008. While the investigation is not yet complete, DOL anticipates making a recommendation to pursue the state's claims. Expiration of the tolling agreement means that we will need to file a court case later this year or risk certain claims being time barred; hence this request for an appropriation to fund the anticipated litigation in FY 2009.

Total

Based upon information gathered to date, DOL anticipates making a recommendation to commence litigation to recover the state's revenue losses, as well as civil penalties and damages under the state's environmental statutes. In March and August of 2006, crude oil leaked from oil transit lines (OTLs) operated by BPXA at Prudhoe Bay. In its Plea Agreement with the United States executed in October 2007, BPXA acknowledged that it "acted negligently by failing to adequately inspect and clean the OTLs." The company is "required to operate the OTLs as a reasonable operator." BPXA "did not expend sufficient resources to address the complex issues of corrosion in the OTLs." "BPXA failed to clean the OTLs with a piece of equipment called a maintenance (or cleaning) pig and inspect the pipe for corrosion activity with a smart pig." These admissions are borne out by our own investigation. BPXA's documents substantiate that these failings resulted in shutdowns and reduced production of tens of millions of barrels of crude oil in 2006-07. The loss of revenue in royalties and taxes to the state for those years amounts to several hundred million dollars.
